Total number of snakes in Zambia: 102

Harmless: 71


Deadly: 15

Dangerous, not deadly: 16

71 snake species are harmless to humans. This means that either they are not venomous or their venom is not strong enough to harm us.



Of the 31 harmful ones, 15 can give a life-threatening bite (deadly) and 16 give a bite which requires medical





Snakebite protocol

In case of a snakebite, time is of the essence!

The shorter the time between bite and professional treatment, the higher the chance of survival.

IN CASE OF A SNAKEBITE ALWAYS:

KEEP VICTIM CALM

TRANSPORT VICTIM TO A HEALTH FACILITY AS QUICKLY AS POSSIBLE!

IN CASE VENOM WAS SPAT IN THE EYE: WASH OUT WITH LOTS OF WATER!

ELEVATE AND IMMOBILISE LIMB

CUT OR SUCK THE BITE AREA APPLY ELECTRIC SHOCK

APPLY OR GIVE ALCOHOL

APPLY HEAT OR ICE

APPLY TRADITIONAL MEDICATION

APPLY A TOURNIQUET, unless advised by an expert.

GIVE ANTI VENOM AS A FIRST AID
